

Now imagine the variety of student organizations and athletic activities in a community like that. And you just might start to get an idea of what Shepherd students find to do every day.






At a Glance

TYPE OF UNIVERSITY Coeducational, state-supported, four-year university with a strong liberal arts emphasis. Admission is competitive.

HISTORY Established in 1871 as a private college. Designated a state-supported teacher's college in 1872. Began granting four-year degrees in 1930. Shepherd College officially became Shepherd University in March 2004.

DEGREES OFFERED Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Music Education, Regents Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Bachelor of Social Work, Master of Arts in Curriculum and Instruction, Master of Business Administration.

ENROLLMENT 3,700 students.
Student-to-faculty ratio: 20 to 1.

CLASS SIZE On average, 20 to 25 students.

ACADEMIC YEAR Two semesters and two five-week summer sessions.

ACTIVITIES Students choose from dozens of campus organizations, including fraternities and sororities, special-interest clubs, professional organizations, honor societies, music groups, intramural and club sports, and student government. Popular weekend events include coffeehouses, open-mic talent shows, movies, deejay dances, and performances by visiting comics and musical artists.

ATHLETIC CONFERENCES Shepherd participates in the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) and is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II.

INTERCOLLEGIATE SPORTS Men's teams compete in football, basketball, baseball, golf, tennis, and soccer. Women's teams compete in basketball, soccer, tennis, volleyball, and softball. Lacrosse is an NCLC club program for men and for women.

TUITION AND FEES, 2005-2006 (yearly)
\$4,046 for residents of West Virginia;
\$10,618 for students from other states.

ROOM AND BOARD, 2005-2006 (yearly)
\$6,020 (higher for upper-level students living in the suite-style residence halls).

FINANCIAL AID Scholarships, loans, grants, and work-study programs are awarded based on need, academic achievement, and special skills.

CAMPUS Situated on 323 acres in historic Shepherdstown, West Virginia. Convenient to the cultural and educational resources of Washington, D.C., and Baltimore, Maryland, and the natural resources of the Shenandoah Valley.
